Understand changes taking place and make decisions with confidence.


Forest Management Plans include:

- Evaluation and recommendations for your woodland, stream, and grassland ecosystems.
- Economic and ecological projections based on different management alternatives.
- Appraisal of tree species, condition, and timber value.

A **Forest Management Plan** may qualify you for additional financial assistance for **management practices** to improve your land -- strategic tree selection, invasive species management, oak savanna restoration, tree and shrub plantings, prescribed burning, and more.



Review opportunities for strategic tree selection in your woodland. The blue painted tree will be removed to enable the red banded tree to thrive.

Native shrubs such as highbush cranberry provide fruit, seeds, and shelter for songbirds and other wildlife.

Prescribed fires in woodlands and oak savannas promote native wildflowers and help young oak seedlings regenerate.
